Pastor's Note



The use of Scripture is central to our Lutheran worship. Many times it comes as a surprise to folks, just how much Scripture is actually incorporated into the service from beginning to end, not counting the Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament, and Gospel readings!

The words of 1 John 1:8-9 show us the importance of examining our lives and their sinful state as we enter into God's presence. "If we say we have no sin, we are deceiving

ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." In spite of our sins, we are accepted by God and in turn we can accept each other.

Paul's words from 2 Corinthians 13:14 are utilized in our "opening" greeting: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

The Kyrie is a cry to the Lord for help and strength. In ancient times, crowds would should "Lord, have mercy on us." An example of this would be Matthew 20:30 where two blindmen are sitting by the road and hearing that Jesus was to pass by they cried out "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David." As the people long ago asked for help, we Christians also ask for mercy from our Savior.

So we begin with the Word of God and we continue with the Word. Prefacing the Gospel reading we echo Simon Peter's words "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." (John 6:68)

Following his resurrection, Jesus appears in the upper room where his disciples have taken refuge behind locked doors and he says, "Peace be with you." (John 20:19-21) In worship, the point of sharing the peace is to drop grudges and be reconciled with the rest of your community. Our congregation truly enjoys sharing the peace. In fact, when there is a full house it can take almost 10 minutes because we make sure everyone receives a joyful handshake and hears God's word of peace for them!

Many more scripture references are yet to come such as -- "Hosanna in the highest..." (Mark 11:9-10); in the Words of Institution, "In the night in which He was betrayed the Lord took bread..." (1 Corinthians 11:23ff) and of course, the prayer our Lord taught us: "Our Father, who are in heaven..." (Matthew 6:9-13).

The blessing spoken by the pastor at worship's end is the Aaronic benediction, the blessing God first gave to Aaron and the other priests to speak to the people of God. It is located in Numbers 6:24-26. "The Lord bless you and keep you; The Lord make His face shine on you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His countenance on you, and give you peace."

These are just a few references. But as you can see, the Word of God given to us BY God is used by us to give our praise, prayer and thanksgiving BACK to the Father!

Drinks and paper goods to be furnished.



Lessons Learned About Church Planting

Director of Mission Growth

From the very foundation of the LCMC Texas District, we have felt compelled by the Great Commission to prioritize church planting. When congregations gathered together to form this association, we recognized our need to help and encourage one another in evangelism and discipleship. It was clear that if our congregations were going to make a kingdom impact here in Texas, we needed to get serious about church planting.

As we come upon our 10th Annual Gathering July 27-28th in New Braunfels, it is time to pause and reflect and renew our zeal for our intended purposes. As we pause and reflect, I thought I'd share a few lessons I've learned about church planting movements to help us advance the Kingdom of God through church planting:

- 1. LCMC Texas does not have a church planting movement ... yet. Movements are best defined by the attention and intention of an influential number of people. We have begun to shift greater attention towards planting churches, but most pastors, church leaders and congregation members see church planting as something that someone else does. We will not have a church planting movement in LCMC Texas without the attention and intention of an influential number of people becoming engaged in the pursuit of planting churches.
- 2. The most effective model for planting churches is parenting: a healthy congregation giving birth to a new church. Unfortunately for most of us who came out of another denomination, church planting was not something that congregations directly participated in and therefore it is often not on the agenda of our pastors, church leaders and congregations for consideration. But in LCMC, we affirm that the local congregation is the front lines of mission and ministry and we need to re-engage the local congregation in directly participating in church planting efforts.
- 3. Getting involved is not as daunting as one might think. Did you know that congregations of less than 200 a week in worship attendance are statistically more likely to plant a church than a congregation with more than 600 a week in worship? Often times people do not get involved simply because they don't know what to do or how to do it ... or they assume its for someone else to do. But God is calling each of us to participate in planting churches and you can help, too! Feel free to contact me and let's talk about what you can do to advance the Kingdom and begin to build a church planting movement among Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ in Texas.
